6. <u>Delegations</u>

6.1 Canadian Nuclear Laboratories (CNL)

Jo Holstead and Mitch MacKay, from Canadian Nuclear Laboratories (CNL) provided an update as part of Council's external partner orientation. They provided information on the background of the CNL, mission of organization, history of Douglas Point Nuclear Generating Station and the decommissioning plans for the site.

6.2 Jackie Ralph, We C.A.R.E. Committee

Jackie Ralph, Co-Chair of We C.A.R.E. Committee and Youth Awareness and Education Supervisor, provided a presentation on the We C.A.R.E Share Event at the Davidson Centre on May 4th, 2023. The presentation included the history of the project, providing information and support to "natural helpers", invitation to the event with Keynote Speaker is Randall Adjei, and how the Municipality can get involved.

Committee of the Whole asked about resources for natural helps now (Kids Help Phone, WES for Youth Online, Keystone, Community Mental Health Association, 211), and January 25 Bell Let's Talk Day.

a. Waterfront Master Plan, Parks Facilities-2023-02

Sean Kelly from pl.ural presented what his team has obtained and heard to date. This provided a glimpse of the direction the Waterfront Master Plan is embarking on. The presentation included the scope of the review, the process to date (background and information, community engagement, preparing the plan), survey results including top three priorities (safety, washrooms, and environment), and next steps (draft final report and plan application).

Committee of the Whole inquired about engagement levels, definition for incremental development (municipal infrastructure vs private development), feedback from community groups, impact of break wall on project, engagement with marina group, inclusion of Bluewater Trailer Park, the next consultation session timing (mid February), and how projects will be prioritized by need.
