Detachment Updates

Calls For Service of Note

Assault – one of the assaults involved a domestic situation and the other involved a neighbour dispute that turned violent.

Other Crimes Against a Person – the one other crimes against a person was an incident involving threats in a neighbour dispute situation.

Theft Under – two of the thefts involved unlocked vehicles that had been entered overnight. Two of the occurrences involved thefts of items from rural properties and one involved the theft of a license plate.

Mischief – three of the mischiefs included damage to a vehicle and building with windows broken and cars keyed. One mischief was reported at the Kincardine Fire Department training area and included damage to windows. One mischief was reported at the Tiverton baseball fields as a truck drove on the grass and one mischief was related to a domestic situation.

- SRO conducted personal safety presentation including a cruiser visit with three kindergarten class at Elgin market Public School.
- SRO conducted personal safety presentation including a cruiser visit with six classes kindergarten to grade 2 classes at St Anthony's Catholic School.
- SRO was invited to attend St Anthony's school grade 4/5 class as a part of an alcohol unit they were studying. SRO spoke about the legalities of alcohol and students tried the ASD and Fatal Vision goggles.
- SRO attended KDSS for SAID Day. Students played basketball and badminton while wearing the Fatal Vision Goggles.
- SRO attended the tyke Track and Field Day at the Davidson Centre (Huron Heights and Elgin Market schools). The SRO was the race marshal for the day.

Community Events / Training

Bike Rodeo – on May 27th officers participated and supported the bike safety event at the Kincardine Legion. Officers had positive interaction with many youth and supported safe cycling messaging.

Bicycle Patrol Training – South Bruce OPP trained three officers to operate bicycles and they are now qualified to patrol the roads and trails on bicycles. Since their training in April, officers have been active in the area.

Multi-cultural Event – South Bruce OPP officers had an information table set up at the multi-cultural event in Kincardine and had positive interactions with 100's of community members. Focus of conversations were around general policing as well as recruitment.
