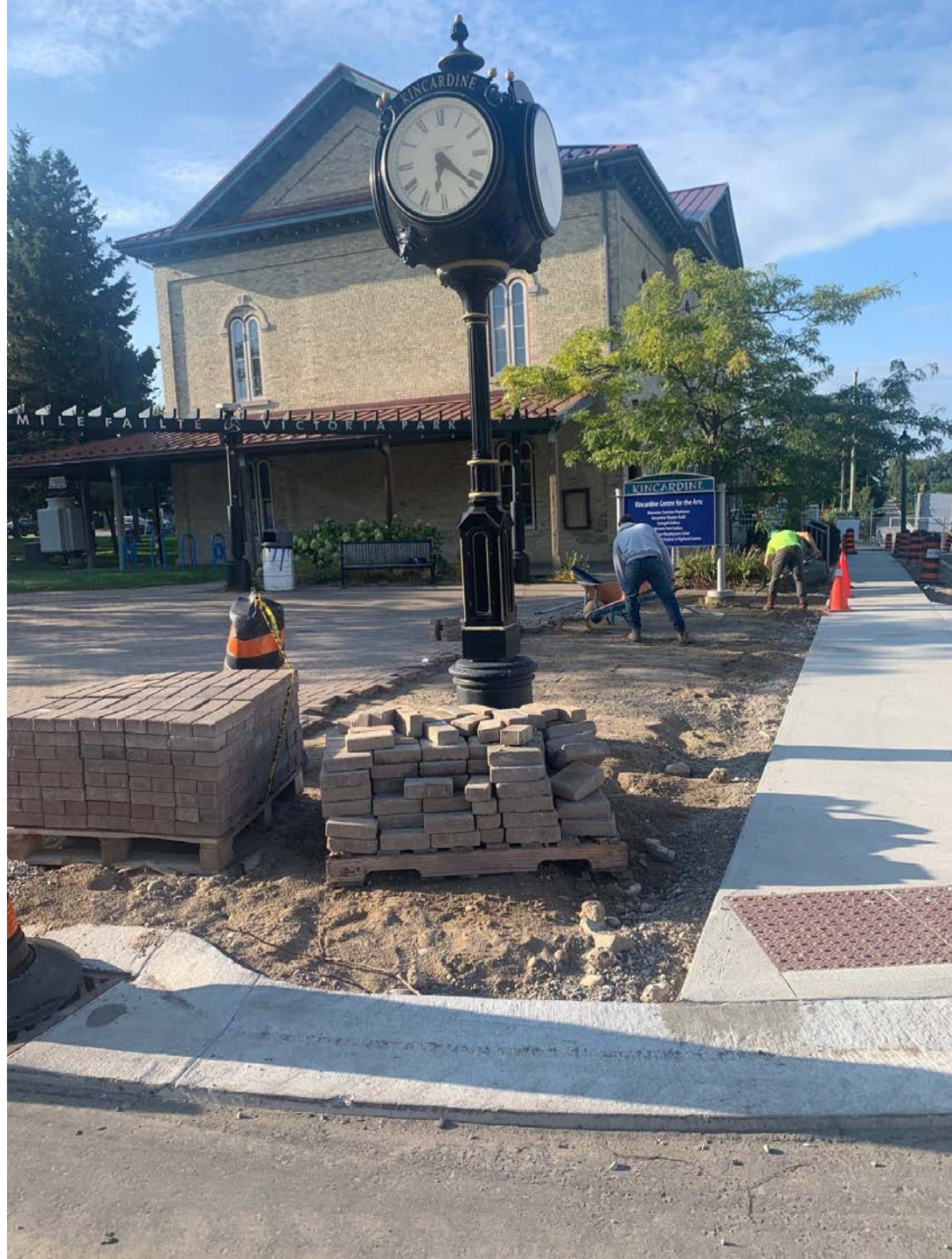

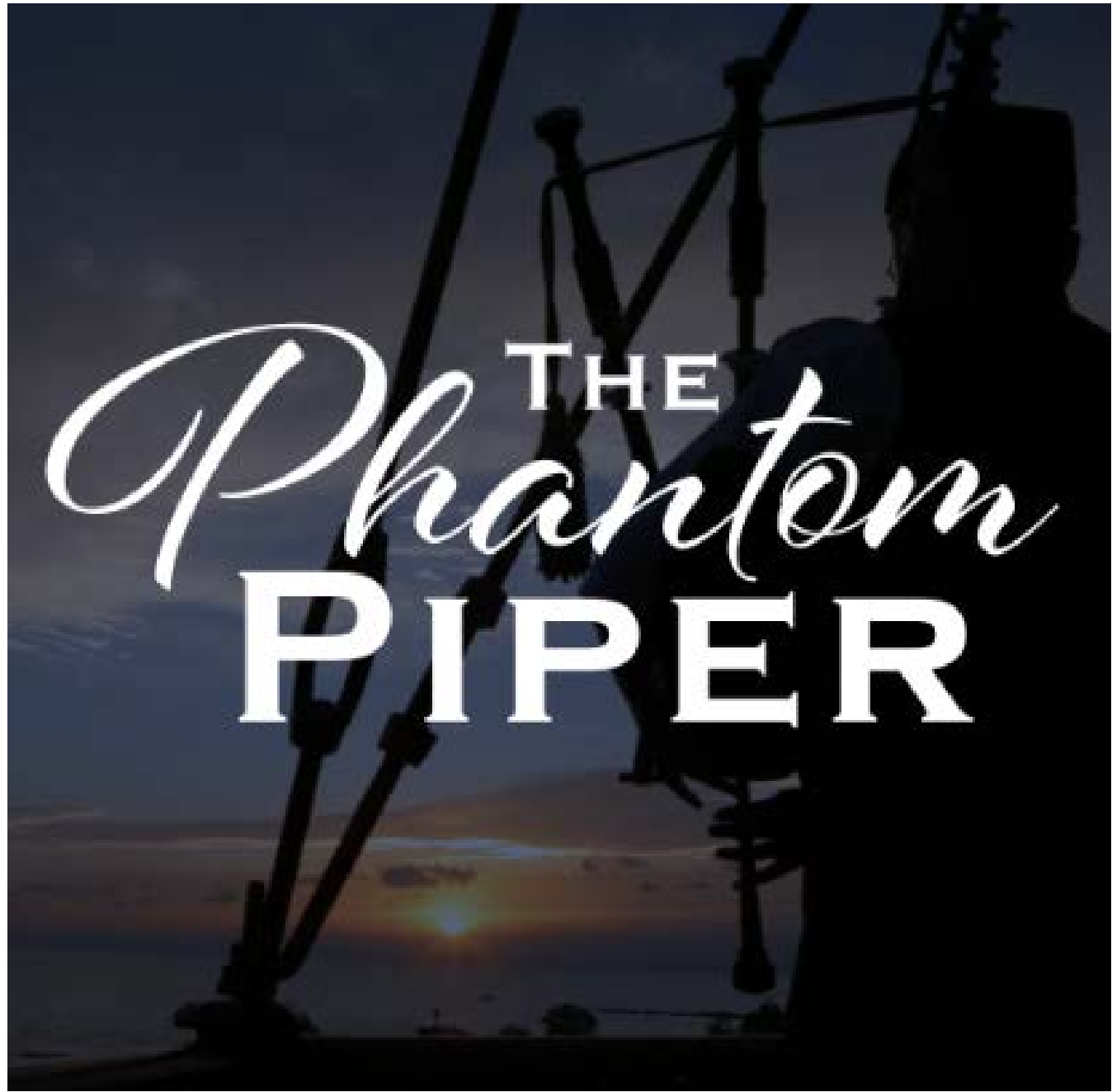

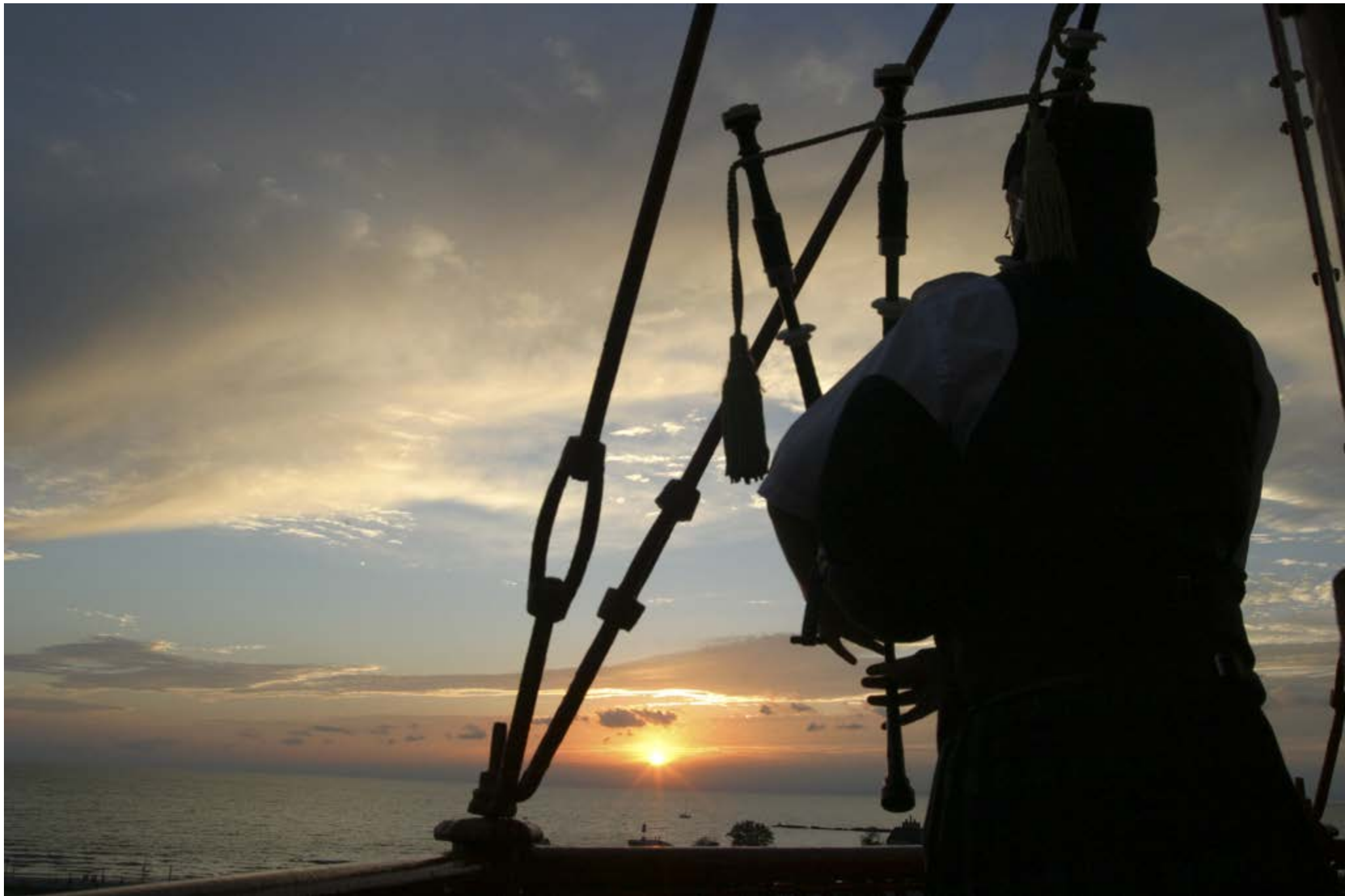














The Kincardine Lighthouse and the Phantom Piper
One of the great wonders of Kincardine is its Lighthouse. Its beacon has been shining since 1851. The Phantom Piper plays atop the Lighthouse, piping down the sun on summer evenings.

The vision for The Phantom Piper came from Eldon Humphreys (1937-2021), a Kincardine resident who, in his retirement, became a wood caricature carver. In 1999, to commemorate Kincardine's 150th anniversary, Eldon carved the Lighthouse and Phantom Piper. On the back of the carving he wrote that the Phantom Piper idea came to him after seeing a similar ritual in Key West, Florida. He believed our Lighthouse, Pipe Band, and beautiful sunsets would make the Phantom Piper a tourist attraction. The idea was accepted by the former Town of Kincardine and the Phantom Piper started in 1996.

Since 1996, the Kincardine Scottish Pipe Band's pipers play on the tower nightly (except Saturdays). The tradition has continued on and at summer's end in 2022, there had been 1,441 appearances by 96 pipers over the first 27 years.

The Phantom Piper has to climb 69 steps on three sets of stairs, the last 13 steps being extremely steep. When they arrive at the light, a small door has to be opened and the piper crawls on hands and knees to the outer rail on the tower. He is careful not to show those assembled below. He is worn under the kilt. After piping the piper then retreats down the same path.

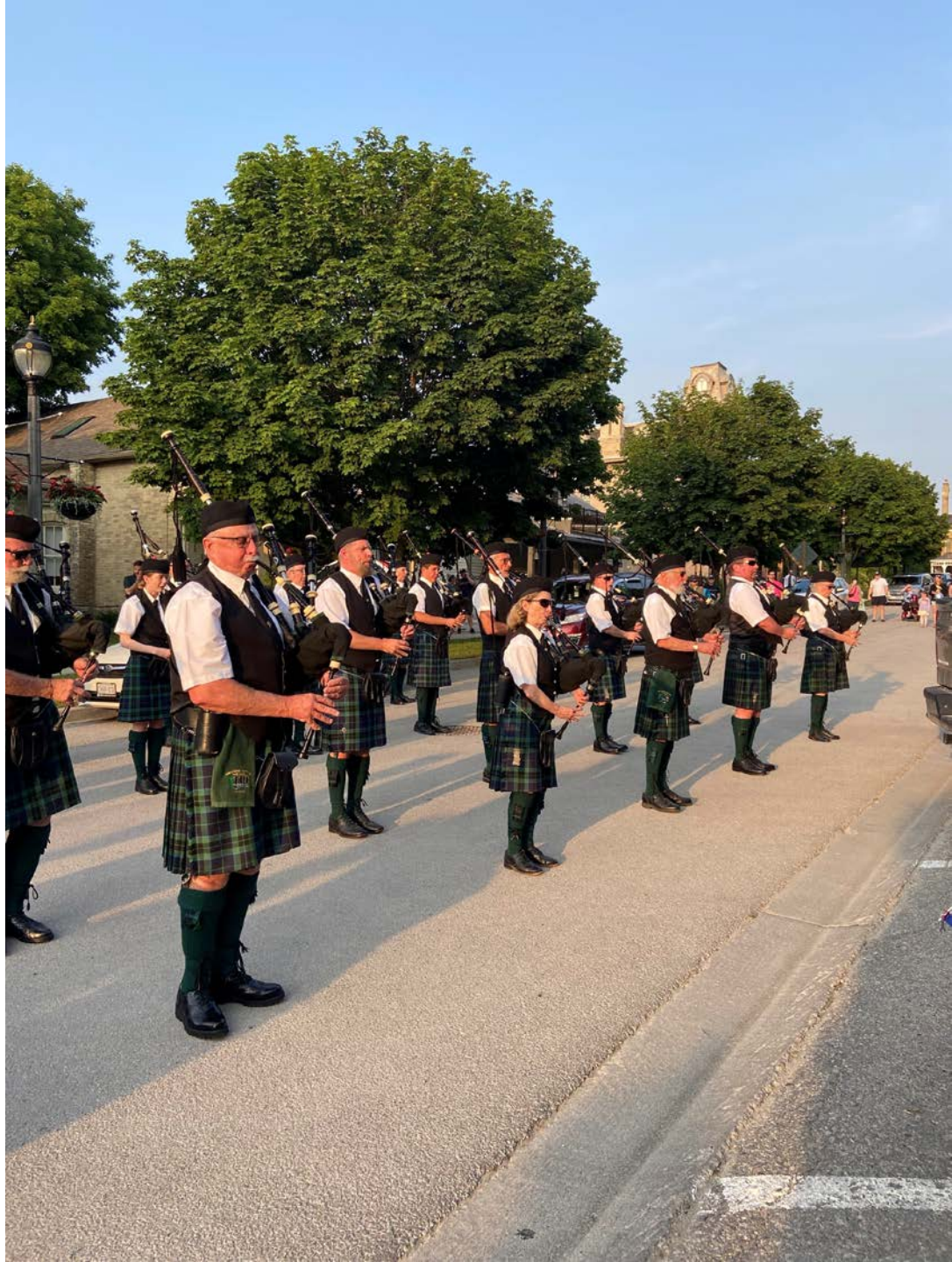
