## DETACHMENT UPDATES

- One of the Sexual Assaults was Historical in nature. The other two involved youth offenders. Sexual Assaults continue to trend upward significantly Year to Date. This can anecdotally be attributed to the continuance of the Me Too Movement and that victims are more comfortable coming forward.
- Of the seven Assaults reported, three were Domestic related. One involved an Assault Police charge, one was as a result of a bar fight and one involved child abuse allegations. Despite this we continue to see a decrease in Assaults Year to Date.
- Property Crimes overall are down in most categories. Mischief has seen a slight increase Year to Date.
- We continue to see a variety of frauds being committed. Lately we have seen the attempts to obtain personal information over text posing as a legitimate company and frauds involving payment with Google or iTunes cards. The holiday season brought Carolers to town who were posing as a legitimate charity but enquiries showed that they were not associated.
- Mischief is the only property crime that shows an increase for 2019. They continue to span a variety of mischiefs from slashed tires, damage from attempt Break and Enters to damaged Christmas lights.
- We investigated a Fatal Motor Vehicle Collision on Highway 21 on Boxing Day.
- Property Damage and Personal Injury collisions are down for this report period and Year to Date.
- Two of the Personal Injury collisions involved pedestrians – one on a scooter. Both the pedestrian and the scooter driver were on the sidewalk.

- Charges of Careless Driving and Obstruct Justice have been laid in regards to the Fail To Remain Personal Injury collision with a cyclist that occurred in the fall.
- The investigation into the collision of the Kincardine Fire and Emergency Services truck enroute to a call for service is complete.
- Insp Miller attended the Change of Command Ceremony for the Cadet Program in December.
- South Bruce O.P.P. and the Municipality of Kincardine's Police Services Board were successful recipients of the Community Safety Grant – Local Priorities. The funding from this grant augments the cost of our School Resource Officer.
- The South Bruce O.P.P. and the Municipality of Kincardine's Police Services Board were successful recipients of the Community Safety Grant – Provincial Priorities. This grant provides funding to address Sexual Violence and Harassment and Human Trafficking. The grant was applied for in partnership with the Municipality of Brockton and the Township of Huron-Kinloss PSBs, as well as Women's House, Victim Services and Violence Prevention Grey-Bruce. A committee has been formed with representatives of each of these organizations and a Coordinator, Chelsea Donohue, has been hired by the Municipality. Community education, training for officers and partner agencies, equipment and resources are all goals for the grant. Our first project is the presentation of three Human Trafficking Awareness sessions, one in each of the three Municipalities.

- South Bruce OPP officers along with members of the Kincardine Fire and Emergency Services and Grey-Bruce EMS participated in a couple of United Way Fundraiser hockey games playing against the Kincardine High School students and teachers.
- South Bruce OPP officers participated in the Festive RIDE campaign. 107 RIDE programs were held across the South Bruce area. Four drivers were charged with Impaired Driving and one received a three day suspension.
