# Notice of Impact Assessment Decision with Reasons

Ottawa — December 20, 2024 — The Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (IAAC) has decided that an impact assessment is required for the Bruce C Nuclear Project (the project) proposed by Bruce Power (the proponent), located in the Municipality of Kincardine, Ontario.

In accordance with subsection 16(2) of the *Impact Assessment Act* (IAA), IAAC (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada) considered each of the following factors:

- the [Initial Project Description](#), and the [response to the Summary of Issues](#), as submitted by the proponent pursuant to sections 10 and 15 of the [IAA \(Impact Assessment Act\)](#);

- the adverse effects within federal jurisdiction, or the direct or incidental adverse effects, that may be caused by the carrying out of the project;
- adverse impacts that the project may have on the rights of Indigenous Peoples of Canada recognized and affirmed by section 35 of the *Constitution Act, 1982*;
- comments received by IAAC (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada) from the public, Indigenous Peoples, federal authorities, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission, and other jurisdictions in relation to the project, as reflected in the Summary of Issues;
- any relevant assessment referred to in section 92, 93 or 95 of the IAA (Impact Assessment Act); and,
- whether a means other than an impact assessment exists that would permit a jurisdiction to address the adverse effects within federal jurisdiction, and the direct or incidental adverse effects, that may be caused by the carrying out of the project.

IAAC (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada) is satisfied that the carrying out of the designated project may cause adverse effects within federal jurisdiction or direct or incidental adverse effects, including effects on the environment or to health, social or economic conditions.

As a result, IAAC (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada) has decided that an impact assessment is required for the project.
