6.1 Promenade on Queen Update

Municipal Council approved the recommendation to proceed with the Promenade on Queen, which will run every Friday evening through Sunday commencing June 25 through Labour Day weekend.

Street closure was approved to include extension north to Durham Street.

Details to follow once staff directives are in place on implementing marketing, vendors and additional facets of the closure- including Accessibility Advisory Committee review of suggestions and concerns identified in the public survey results.

6.2 Dr. Solomon Secord Monument - Heritage Kincardine Report

Committee discussed the report that will be presented to Council at a tobe-determined date in April concerning the status of the Secord Monument, located in front of the Kincardine library.

The report will be seeking support for public engagement as options for the monument are considered.

With the monument located in the BIA geography, the committee discussed the need and desire to be part of future conversations.

- Market in the Park has been given approval to move forward this summer at a reduced capacity to accommodate the 100 person limit (of

which includes vendors present on site). Approval was only provided Tuesday morning, so details will be provided as event roll out proceeds. - Driftscape App has been launched - this will act as a virtual visitor guide for the entire Municipality and allow updates to be implemented instantly as required
